The town was founded in 1812 by Englishman Samuel Slater, to this day still considered the great pioneer of American textiles. Believing that the textile industry had reached its peak in England, Slater looked to New England's emerging industry opportunities and recognized the superior water power source of Webster's Lake Chargoggagoggmanchauggauggagoggchaubunagungamaugg. The Slater Textile Mills built along its shores, is one of the textile industry's landmarks, operating well into the 20th century.

The lake, long considered one of "Nature's gifts to New England" was a central gathering place for the region's Nipmuc Indian Tribe before the mills were established near what was known as the Manchaug Village. The lake's name translates to "Englishmen at Manchaug at the Fishing Place at the Boundary" and though it is no longer a power source, it remains one of the area's main attractions for fishing, swimming, boating and other water sports.

Webster population is approximately 16,700 and growing as residents are attracted to the area's attractive housing, recreational, business and edu-cational opportunities, in addition to its convenient access to Boston (56 miles), Providence (33 miles) and Worcester (18 miles).
